

#### LOON LAKE KID'S FISHING DERBY 2021

The ice is off the lake, it is time to start fishing. This year's fishing derby is set for the first Saturday in June. It is a free fishing weekend for adults, so you can take the children to the lake and have some fun. The way it works is this - come to the boat launch at 8:30 a.m. to get registered. A bag of treats will be provided for the fish and the kids. Take it and find your secret spot to catch a big one, but keep the little ones too. All size fish count. At 11:00 come back to the boat ramp and get your fish weighed.

The participants will be divided into 5 groups according to age. Each one of the groups will have a 1st, 2nd and 3rd place finisher. No one leaves empty-handed, everyone gets to pick a prize. #### ONGOING WATER QUALITY MONITORING

It is important to monitor the quality of the water that enters Loon Lake. Monitoring provides the objective evidence necessary to make sound decisions on managing Loon Lake's water quality today and in the future. Water-quality monitoring is used to alert us to any potential problems and to determine how to address any problems that may be detected.

You cannot tell much about the quality of water simply by looking at it; most pollutants are invisible to our eyes. Nutrients are the primary cause of water pollution. The primary pollutants in this category are nitrogen and phosphorus. This type of pollution has impaired more than 3.8 million acres of lakes, ponds, and reservoirs nationwide. Excess nutrients cause algae to grow out of control and use all the available oxygen in water, killing off other organisms that need oxygen to live.

The most effect method for identifying these harmful nutrients is to conduct testing of the water entering a body of water like Loon Lake. The Watershed Foundation (TWF) conducts monthly testing on the Winters ditch which is the largest tributary supplying water into Loon Lake. Watershed Foundation Baseline Water Quality Assessment consists of monthly water chemistry sample collection. Sampling occurs regardless of flow and weather conditions from February to October. The 2021 monitoring season will be the 11<sup>th</sup> consecutive sampling year. Two sample bottles are filled for analysis of:

The data collected are compared to a set of water quality targets and compared to previous years and baseline standards.

TWF also annually conducts a Snapshot Monitoring day in which the same types of data are collected from a total of four tributaries feeding into Loon Lake. This is part of over two hundred citizen scientists joined forces to collect, test and analyze water samples from across our locality. All the data collected is

again compared to previous years data and baseline standards. All the information is mapped and made available on the TWF website (<a href="https://watershedfoundation.org/2020-snapshot-day-results/">https://watershedfoundation.org/2020-snapshot-day-results/</a>).

Snapshot Monitoring Day will be held on September 23<sup>rd</sup> this year. You do not need any prior training or experience to participate!



# LOON LAKE FISH MANAGEMENT NEWS

The Loon Lake fish group will be active again in 2021. As you probably know, the extraordinary situation with the Covid-19 virus, forced the committee to suspended fundraising efforts for the 2020 summer season. While we were unable to stock as many fish as we had hoped last year, we were able to stock 275 Muskies and 1500 Walleyes, thanks to the generosity of private donations and a successful Shootout last fall.

Our 2021 goal is 400 Muskie and 1500 Walleye. The sustained support from the Loon Lake community and generous sponsors is greatly appreciated and needed to continue our work. Our primary source of income is the annual raffle that is drawn at the end of our annual corn hole tourney. Tickets will go on sale soon and the details for the corn hole tourney will be released later in the season. This year's tourney will be after the fall meeting, August 28<sup>th</sup>, at the Loon Lisle Nature Reserve.

If you are planning to view the show from the lake, remember that it's important to maintain a safe distance from the barges.



The second Saturday of each month, June through September, we will be collecting aluminum cans as a fundraiser for our annual Fireworks Display! To donate, bag your cans and set them out by the curb by 9:00AM and a crew of volunteers will be by to pick them up!
