Loon Lisle Nature Reserve plans – Carol Kurtz and Clark Milestone

- Pavilion project and budget -copies of budget and picture of proposed pavilion
 - Merry Lea and Goshen College created a plan of improvements. We decided Phase One –
 Prairie Grass, Phase Two Pavilion, Phase 3 Trails through wetland
 - Budget spreadsheet recapping fiscal year 2021 income versus expenditure
 - Dues collected \$4890, general fundraising \$12183, fireworks \$8728.40 total income \$27006.40 minus expenses \$14480.06 GAIN 2021 \$12,526.34
 - Our accounts are increasing due to our Fundraising events.

- BALANCE OF WORKING ACCOUNTS FISCAL 2021 \$80,558.20 that we can use for our Association needs. Pavilion is an investment in future and we have the funds to build now.
- Pavilion Construction Estimate of material only all volunteer labor
 - Thanks to Dave Steiss and his masonry talent and contacts we have a blueprint and a source for the bricks.
 - Footers and 2200 yards concrete \$4000
 - Material lumber and shingles \$13000 (no electric and no ceiling)
 - To include electric and ceiling we are asking for \$25000 with all volunteer labor.
 - Insurance to cover the structure \$200 per year
 - Noble County requires Driveway permit, Blueprint, DNR permit (which we already received).
 - New survey needed before building permit will be issued. Noble County requiring us to meet their Unified Development Ordinance. They are requesting new survey paperwork combining the 3 lots. With a cost of \$1000 which will be included in our estimate.
 - Security light will be \$90/year. After certified electric run we will have a meter installed for events (with lock installed)
 - Estimated start date in June.
 - Raise money by renting out Pavilion? Cannot charge rent per the Conservation agreement to use the pavilion but can request donations. Can hold fundraising events per Easement Agreement
 - Toilet facilities. Porta John may be placed in future per season for all events.
 Otherwise, responsibility is the user of the site.
 - Pier can be installed. We have a pier already stored on site. Just need DNR approval when we are ready
 - Suggestion to have a donation to cover costs with sponsor name is put on structure.
 - Fundraising will continue. Fundraising made it possible to get to this stage.
 - If over \$25000 the Board cannot approve additional it would be brought back up for a vote at the Membership meeting
 - A sign-up sheet was passed around for Labor volunteers
 - picnic tables will be considered in the future after structure is built
 - if disturbance Conservation Officers have jurisdiction, then Sheriff
 - Food donation can be added to volunteer sheet for day of built
- Motion by Walt Hessler to approve a not to exceed material price of \$25,000 for pavilion as outlined in presentation, seconded by Janet Dalrymple, unanimously approved
- Serenity Garden: inscribed pavers \$50 and tree adoption \$125 process
 - o a sample of engraved paver was presented at the registration table.
 - o Prairie is a work in progress, patio has been completed with 12 engraved pavers inlayed.
 - Raised \$700 so far as part of our fundraising at \$50 per paver.

Lake Enhancement—Walt Hessler

The goal of Lake Enhancement activities is to "Enhance and protect the waters of Loon Lake and the native species that inhabit the lake for the betterment of the property owners and visitors". The following are just some of the activities performed to accomplish this goal:

- Placement of LLPOA buoys to protect shallow areas and reduce the amount of sediment and weeds stirred up by boating activity
- Work with The Watershed Foundation (TWF) on projects that positively impact the quality of the water entering Loon Lake. This includes active participation on TWF's Watershed Committee.
- Conduct regular water testing and assist TWF's water monitoring efforts on the two largest ditches inputting water into Loon Lake.
- Monitor the Lake for invasive species such as Curlyleaf Pond Weed and Starry Stonewort algae.
 Work with Aquatic Weed Control and needed to deal with these invasive weeds as needed.
- o Spray for Purple Loosestrife which is an invasive weed that grows near the lake
- Measure depths in the retention pond upstream from the public access site and coordinate dredging as needed
- Work to obtain grants as needed for larger projects as required
- Create Lake Enhancement educational articles for each LLPOA Newsletter. These can be found at <u>www.loonlakeindiana.org/newsletters/</u>. Some of these are also reposted on the Loon Lake Property Owners Association Facebook page.

- 4) We have contacted our State Representative regarding the State of Indiana publishing and making available to the public the DNR Safe Boating manual. We have had no significant reply yet.
