# **Old Business/Committee Reports**

Approval of 2022 Board Members

Loon Lake Fish Management Group – Clark Milestone (vacation) Terry Huffman filled in for Clark. Selling tickets to help fund the stocking which will be Walleye this year not muskie. They need funds as the hatchery costs have gone up.

Loon Lisle Reserve (Pavilion and port a johns) – Carol Kurtz

Isn't it fantastic and thanks to our Master Mason Dave Steiss along with many volunteers! Last May the Members approved a budget of \$30,000. As of Fiscal year-end 2022 the pavilion construction costs total was \$24,984.

A new 2023 Budget spreadsheet was passed out to the members and reviewed showing expenses versus income assuring that money donated is tracked by the Board throughout the year. Important to the Board that the Associations funds are spent for the projects the donations are earmarked or tagged. The spreadsheet is important to validate the trust the membership has given to the Board.

The Budget spreadsheet will also be used to track that the dues of \$30 annually (\$4890) will be sufficient to cover essential expenses of taxes, insurance, and utilities now that increases have occurred with the addition of the Pavilion.

The spreadsheet detailed dues plus fundraising totals ended with a profit of \$10,001.18 for 2022.

Applications to rent the Pavilion are on our website. The rent is \$200 with \$100 refunded after the event if all rules and regulations are followed. This is public property don't have to rent but you would not get electricity without renting.

Two used Porta johns were purchased at \$125 ea with clean out when needed at \$47. If rented it was quoted at \$175 per month with \$85 per clean out. Saving the Association approximately \$1000 per year. A privacy fence was erected to maintain the beauty of the Reserve.

Can Pick UP – Bob Gallivan and Brian Clark

Throughout the summer, we will continue to have aluminum can pick-ups on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday of each month. Place the cans in trash bag and leave at the end of the driveway before 9:00am. These cans help to pay for our fireworks, so please donate. This is for only cans. \*\*PLEASE do NOT place pie pans, aluminum foil, glass, plastic bottles or trash inside the bags.\*\*

Kid's Fishing Derby – JoAnn Butler (Carol Kurtz)

Located at the pavilion at the Loon Lisle Reserve on Saturday, June 3, 2023. Any child ages 2-16 is eligible. Registration is at 8:30am. Weigh in is at 11:00am. This is a free fishing weekend for

While you wait to find out who has the heaviest fish bag, grab a hot dog, chips, and a drink.

June 3<sup>rd</sup> No license needed. Thanks to the donations last year it was not necessary to pass around a bucket for the meeting to donate this year.

Dave Fry and his wife Thea started the Derby in 1993 thirty years ago with 14 kids. Last year JoAn had 60 kids.
