ONE OF LOON LAKE'S FAVORITE BIRDS


The Sandhill Crane is native to Indiana and to Loon Lake. These birds can often be seen and heard in large flocks flying across the sky over Loon Lake during migration seasons (Fall and Spring). You can typically hear them throughout spring, summer and fall in the morning and early evening. These mostly brownish gray feathered birds have a distinctive rolling trumpet-like call that can be heard from miles away.

Most Sandhill Cranes migrate through Indiana while some breed in northern Indiana. The cranes typically overwinter in places like Bosque del Apache, New Mexico, and Anahuac National Wildlife Refuge, Texas and spend their summers foraging in northern U.S. and Canada.



These large birds forage in open areas like bogs, marshy wetland areas like Pisgah Marsh near State Road 5 just west of Loon Lake. Sandhill Cranes are omnivores and eat a variety of things like seeds, berries, nuts, tubers (roots), and small animals (e.g., crayfish, reptiles, nesting birds). You can see them around Loon Lake in open fields and in fields near Pisgah Marsh.

Typically, these birds breed and nest in open wetlands, fields, and prairies. Mates display to each other by bowing, dancing and males toss clumps of grass in the air to attract females. They mate for life and stay with their mates year-round. Nests are built in vegetation like cattails, sedges, or grasses. Once hatched, the baby chicks can leave the nest and are capable of swimming within 8 hours of hatching. The juveniles stick close by their parents for 9 or 10 months. Sandhill Cranes can live to be an astounding 20-35 years old with the oldest know bird to be over 37 years old.



Fun Facts:

- Sandhill Cranes have a call that is loud and unique due to their long tracheas (windpipes) that coil into their chests and help the sound develop a lower pitch.
- They warn off predators by spreading their wings (with a wingspan of 6 feet) and hissing. If that doesn't scare predators away, the birds can resort to attacking by leaping in the air and kicking.
- The Sandhill Crane is listed as a species of special concern and is not considered endangered. The most recent numbers show populations as stable and increasing.

Watch for these unique large birds in the open fields as you travel the roads around Loon Lake and listen for their distinctive call in the mornings and evenings.




